New Honorees for Orange and Purple

Every year, the HCASC Program Advisory Committee selects noteworthy African Americans to represent the round robin divisions. For 2008, the legendary Buffalo Soldiers, who bravely served our nation will represent the Orange Division, while entrepreneur and financier, Maggie Walker, will represent the Purple Division.



The Buffalo Soldiers helped shape America's frontier in hundreds of operations.

Buffalo Soldiers was the name given by the plains Indians for the African American members of the 9th and 10th cavalry regiments and the 38th, 39th, 40th and 41st infantry regiments. The term Buffalo Soldier was used to describe any African American soldier and today refers to any Army unit that were born from the 9th and 10th cavalry units.

In nearly 30 years of frontier service, Buffalo Soldiers took part in almost 200 military engagements. Twenty-three Buffalo Soldiers have received the highest military award, the Medal of Honor. When not fighting, Buffalo Soldiers built forts and roads, installed telegraph lines, located water holes, escorted wagon trains, cattle drives, stagecoaches, and mail runs, and protected settlers from renegades. Buffalo Soldiers built the first trail to the top of Mt. Whitney (at the time, the highest known mountain in the U.S.), and the first usable wagon road into Sequoia's Giant Forest in Sequoia National Park.

One of the most famous Buffalo Soldiers, Captain Charles Young, was the third African American to graduate from West Point and at the time of his death in 1922, the highest-ranking African American in the U.S. Military.



Maggie Walker was a forward-thinking businesswoman in the banking industry.

Maggie Walker was a noted African American businesswoman, teacher and civic leader.

Maggie spent her childhood at the Van Lew mansion in Richmond, Virginia where her mother worked as a cook's assistant. As an abolitionist, Miss Van Lew made sure that all of her employees received a good education. It was here that Maggie began to learn the value and importance of education.

At the age of fourteen, Maggie joined the Independent Order of St. Luke where she tended to the sick and aged, advocated for humanitarian causes, and emphasized integrity and self-worth. She served in numerous capacities for the Order including the top leadership position of Right Worthy Grand Secretary, a position she held until her death in 1933.

In 1902, she established a newspaper for the Order, The St. Luke Herald. Shortly thereafter in 1903, she chartered the St. Luke Penny Savings Bank. As the bank's first president, she became the first woman to charter a bank in the United States. She later served as chairman of the board of directors when the bank merged with two others to create the Consolidated Bank & Trust Co., an African American owned institution that still exists today.

Be Prepared for HBCU Grad Expo

The HCASC Graduate School Expo allows students to get personal one-on-one attention from recruiters at some of the top HBCU graduate programs. In fact, some students have been accepted to programs and received scholarships on the spot!

Representatives from 13 different institutions will participate in the 2008 HBCU Graduate Studies Expo. Since a large number of HCASC participants that go on to attend graduate and professional school after completing their undergraduate studies, we have developed a graduate school expo to accompany the competition.

Students should come prepared with the following paperwork:

- 1) An official transcript
- 2) Several copies of a resume
- 3) A statement of educational objectives
- 4) Letters of recommendation from 2-4 faculty members (on their letterhead)

The Expo will take place in the Palm Ballroom Foyer (right next door to the Honda Expo). Representatives will be on hand Saturday, March 29th, between 10 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

Students should bring additional copies of the above documents in order to fully explore their options with the institutions listed below. Don't miss out on your chance to secure a terrific graduate school experience. Check out the Grad Expo!
