For the second year in a row, a first time champion captured the Honda Campus All-Star Challenge (HCASC) National Championship. Oakwood University won the title and a \$50,000 institutional grant for their university. In fact, all four semi-finalists were in pursuit of their first championship title.

Oakwood triumphed after a thrilling three round face-off against the wellprepared team from Alcorn State University. The championship literally came down to the last few seconds as Alcorn heroically struggled to earn a game-tying 10 points on the last bonus question of the match.

The exciting finale was the culmination of 28 rounds of gameplay for all 64 teams. From the round robin games through the play-offs, the 2008 tournament was filled with nail-biting finishes, including a few "sudden death" stunners.

The HCASC program includes months of preparation, practices, campus tournaments, online games, and expanding participation in Pre-NCT tournaments. Because teams spend most of the year

participating in the program, the "Strong 64" are increasingly competitive each year.

Oakwood maintained great discipline and focus in their journey to the winner's circle. Dr. Rennae Elliott, Oakwood's veteran coach, worked tirelessly with her team throughout the year. Months later, the team's dedication and hard work was rewarded with a national championship. President Delbert Baker, as is his custom, was in attendance and proudly shared the team's accomplishment.

The closing awards banquet celebrated the achievements of all participants. Following the crowd-pleasing performance by Black Violin, Honda's Marc Burt introduced a new HCASC tradition: closing shout-outs from each of the round robin divisions. It was a perfect way to close another HCASC weekend in Orlando.

All eyes now turn to 2009, when HCASC celebrates 20 years of excellence that has inspired thousands of students, volunteers and Honda associates to become "Friends for Life."
