The 17th annual HCASC opening ceremony started this year's competition with a theme of "your challenging spirit." This year's theme stresses that each challenge in life prepares students for the road ahead, giving them an opportunity to find and define themselves.

Eric Conn charged students to recognize and work through these challenges, and social commentator and talk show host, Tavis Smiley drove the sentiment home. Smiley now hosts *Tavis Smiley* on PBS and *The Tavis Smiley Show* on the PRI radio network.

He stated that success should be measured by what one becomes and can be determined by personal definition. He shared with the Strong 64 the distinction between greatness and success, and the importance of knowing the difference.

To illustrate the success of HCASC players, three alums were inducted into the third class of the HCASC Alumni Hall of Fame, created during the 15th anniversary HCASC tournament.

Matthew Barnhill, a member of North Carolina A&T State University's 1990 Nationals team, is currently the Senior Vice President of Market Research for Black Entertainment Television. Barnhill started the department in 2000, and during his tenure won eight Telly Awards for promotional excellence. To serve his community, Barnhill is on the board of directors for AIRS, an organization focused on providing housing and life skills training to families that are affected by HIV/AIDS.

Graduating with a Bachelor of Arts from Morgan State University, Thaddeus Hoffmeister played on MSU's team from 1992-1995. After completing his undergraduate degree, he received his law degree from Northeastern University School of Law and now serves as the Chief Counsel and Legislative Director for Congressman Bob Filner. He also serves as a Captain in the United States Army Reserves, and is an international/operational law attorney.

Born in Heidelberg, Germany, Captain Myles B. Caggins III played for four years with Hampton University. After completing the Army Reserves Officer Training Corps, he went on to complete the Ordinance Officers Basic Corps and the Combined Logistics Captains Career Course with Honors. During his career he has received several commendations including the Bronze Star.

The Hall of Fame highlights greatness beyond the gameroom. These HCASC alums inducted this year, show the strength of the minds that compete in the tournament. Every year the teams come better prepared than before, with each competitor, possessing that challenging spirit.
