FOUR TEAMS REMAIN IN THE HUNT

Saturday morning dawned with all of HCASC's eight divisions in play. Many room leaders were not decided until the day's final round.

The Bessie Smith division was hotly contested with Alabama A&M surviving a loss to Mississippi Valley and capturing the banner. Four teams finished with 4-3 records; Howard came out of the room because of head-to-head victories.

In the Turner division, Southern-Baton Rouge was undefeated on Saturday, earning a 6-1 record, including a tight 200-180 win over Xavier. The Jaguars were joined in the playoffs by NC Central, whose victories over Paine and Langston brought them to the Sweet 16.

In Aldridge, Univ. of the District of Columbia defeated Norfolk State 385-165; both teams earned a 6-1 record and playoff berths.

West Virginia State stayed unbeaten in Wells, accompanied to the Sweet 16 by Clark Atlanta, another team with a 6-1 record.

The hard-fought Bowser division was clinched by Grambling when they defeated UMES 255-185. Winston-Salem State locked up the second spot with an afternoon victory over

Spelman, bringing the Rams to 5-2.

In the DuSable division, FAMU remained unbeaten and took the spot as division leader from Oakwood. However, the Ambassadors 6-1 record from Friday still secured their spot in the Sweet 16.

Both Harris-Stowe and Hampton made it in, with the Hornets on top after a 345-260 win that decided the Beckwourth leader. The Sweet 16 was rounded out by Tennessee State and Tuskegee, two titans who clashed in Cuffee, with the Tigers preserving their 7-0 record with a 400-135 victory.

The playoffs opened in dramatic and exciting fashion, with West Virginia State besting Clark Atlanta 185-180 in overtime. Joining them in the Elite Eight were FAMU, Hampton, UDC, Harris-Stowe, Tuskegee, Grambling, and Tennessee State.

The Final Four was set after evening matches. Tennessee State and Tuskegee will have a rematch of their divisional showdown, while FAMU will face UDC. The Firebirds will make their first semifinals since a 1992 appearance, after defeating Oakwood and West Virginia State to capture the last semifinal slot.
