- 1. Take advantage of the opportunities to meet and get to know players from other teams, both in your division and in the tournament as a whole. You will meet up with these people over and over in life; it pays to network now!

- **8.** Learn from the teams you compete against or watch, but don't change the way you approach each game. Every team's strategy is unique.
- **9.** While playing, listen to each question carefully. Pay attention to pronouns and time periods to help you quickly home in on a correct answer. Try not to miss any parts of your team's bonuses.
- **10.** Watch games in other divisions to pick up info and to see competitors outside of "your room." You may meet them in the playoffs.
