North Carolina Central's Randy Johnson represented his alma mater on six NCT teams, went to five nationals where in 1997 he was a part of NCCU's final four team. Today, Johnson runs a juvenile diversion program. He earned a J.D. from the University of Pittsburgh and has accepted a commission to the JAG Corps in the U.S. Army.

Both honorees competed in the HCASC era that featured four sectional competitions that sent teams to a televised national on BET.

Sheila Johnson, co-founder of BET and owner of Salamander Hospitality, delivered this year's keynote address. As the first black female billionaire, Johnson shared her life story as a play with three acts. As impressive as her achievements are she was even more impressed by the talent in the room. Johnson stated that all the achievers in the room should strive for excellence and reminded them that the greatest risk in life is to play it safe.
