The end of Saturday round-robin game play is a second beginning for the teams that earn a Sweet 16 birth. It all begins anew as the goal becomes "making it to the stage" as opposed to the earlier goal of "making it out of the room."

This year brings different faces to the stage. Alcorn State last made it to the semifinals in 2003, Howard University in 2002 (second place), Oakwood University in 1998 and Southern University-Baton Rouge in 2000 (second place).

The Braves of Alcorn State, defeated Morehouse in the Sweet 16 and went on to a rematch with fellow Wells division team Tuskegee. Alcorn found its groove in the second half anticipating toss-ups and capitalizing on bonuses, besting Tuskegee, 315-165.

Howard University in a strong showing overtook Langston and went on to meet Alabama A&M. Playing the game in stride, the D.C. HBCU took its place in the final four.

Oakwood had a tight fight in its Sweet 16 game with Hampton, ending the half behind by five points. They roared back in the second half and won by a commanding 110 points. Carrying the momentum into the Elite Eight game, Oakwood moved on to defeat West Virginia State enroute to the Final Four.

Returning to the scene of its 2007 Sweet 16 disappointment, Southern won a nail-biter with FAMU and then moved on to a Bayou Classic squared. Grambling and SUBR met in an HCASC replay of the Louisiana classic game. It ended in the same fashion with an SUBR victory.
