The short format of the tweet is a defining characteristic of Twitter, allowing information sharing that's quicker than email, less personal than SMS, and more portable than instant messaging (IM).

Commenting on live events like HCASC is fun via Twitter — especially when there are several Twitter users covering the same event. By ending your tweets with "#hcasc", you can use search.



# Game Tips
