IMPORTANT CHANGES FOR SEASON 21

The 21st season of the Honda Campus All-Star Challenge (HCASC) is underway. This year, 80 HBCUs will vie to compete in the National Championship in Orlando, Florida, April 10-13, 2010.

As a result of economic realities, the HCASC program has undergone some significant changes for the coming year. The program has been carefully and thoughtfully reviewed and restructured to ensure that the core aspects of the program remain intact, even in difficult times.

At its heart, the program brings together students for an academic quiz competition that highlights the accomplishments and academic abilities of America's HBCUs and fosters the creation of lifelong friendships.

An equally important part of Honda's unwavering commitment is to maintain the level of direct HBCU grant support while

continuing to provide the NCT experience for as many teams as possible. Accordingly, the following changes will be in place for the 2009-2010 season.

First, the NCT will feature a field of 48 teams, selected in the same manner as previous seasons. Second, teams will travel with four players and a coach.

Third, for the first time, all registered teams that complete and certify Part 1 Qualification materials will receive a minimum grant of \$1,000.

The changes streamline NCT competition in a number of ways. Round robin play will be completed in one day. That means students, volunteers and staff miss one less day from their institutions. Further, gameplay will begin on Sunday, thereby insuring that all divisions and teams will have a uniform gameplay distribution. Must be submitted online. Please check all spellings, travel dates and other issues that could affect a player's availability carefully with the players before submitting this form.

As a reminder, all Part 1 materials must be submitted and certified to be qualified for the new \$1,000 grants.

The Part 2 Deadline is **January 26**, **2010**. Again, schools are encouraged to practice with their students, keep in contact

and select their teams before the deadline.

Coaches, keep in touch with your team



The holidays connect family and friends, and your HCASC players are an important part of that circle. Here are some tips to ensure that everyone is on the same page as schools reopen in January.

- Make sure to have current email, home and cell phone numbers for each player as well as back-up players.
- Touch base often. Many universities are shut down a full month during the Winter break. A lot can happen in that time. If a player has to leave the team, you want to be able to contact alternates.
- Encourage the team to play the HCASC on-line games during the break. Research and question writing assignments will help keep players on their toes.
- If pre-registration for the Spring semester is possible, request that your students complete the process. This can save time in confirming eligibility upon their return to campus.
- The dates of the NCT are April 10-13, 2010. Make sure no family commitments have arisen that would create a conflict. Remember, there are fees associated with player changes after Part 2 has been submitted.
- If the team is in town, a holiday scrimmage can be a great way to involve family and friends in the fun!

Strong communication is vital to success in HCASC. These few simple tips can help maintain a competitive edge and peace of mind in the midst of all the holiday cheer.

2010 Pre-NCT Tournament Schedule

To help prepare teams for the NCT, there are official HCASC Pre-NCT Tournaments. HCASC supplies the game questions for these tournaments at no cost to the hosts.

There are "Group A" Tournaments and "Group B" Tournaments. Each HBCU may attend only one "Group A" and one Group B" tournament (two Pre-NCT Tournaments total).


